# Including WWF in your Will - HOW TO

## Speak to your family and loved ones

Making or updating your Will is an incredibly personal and significant decision. Consider your family and friends and then reflect on including a gift to WWF. Discuss your decision with your loved ones, sharing your vision for the future with them.

## Decide what kind of gift to include

A residual bequest has the greatest impact in the future. You can make a gift of the residue (remainder) of your estate, or a share of the residue, once other specific gifts and expenses have been taken care of.

You can also choose to leave a percentage share of your estate or a specific bequest.

## Enlist the help of a professional

Your Will is an important legal document, and should be worded correctly to ensure your wishes are carried out. A solicitor or public trustee can help with this process.
