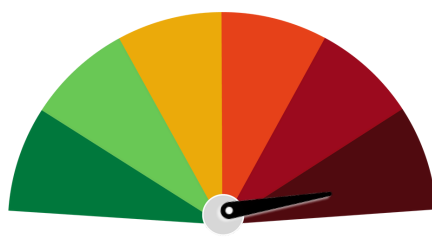

AUSTRALIA'S NATIONAL PERFORMANCE ON THREATENED SPECIES PROTECTION **LAGGING**



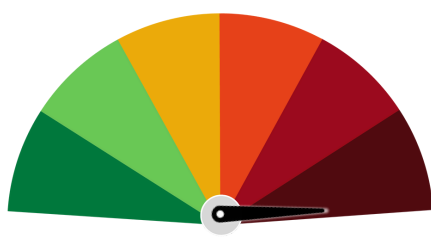

The future of Australia's iconic wildlife and the places they call home are under threat. Across Australia, more than 2,000 animals, plants and ecological communities are known to be threatened with extinction. Many of these are found nowhere else in the world.

WWF-Australia's Threatened Species Report Card reveals the state of threatened species in each Australian federal electorate. An overall grade is determined by combining the latest available data across five key indicators for the threatened species known or likely to occur in each electorate. These indicators measure whether species have enough federal government funding for recovery, whether they have a current recovery plan, whether they have enough of their habitat protected, whether they have improved in threat status, and their chance of persistence.
