Every gift helps fund projects that protect animals, habitats, and humanity across the globe.



VISIONARY FUTURES REQUIRE VISIONARY PEOPLE

Your gift will give our natural world the chance it needs to face the gravest threats.

Already generous gifts have helped pioneer conservation programs that are reversing the damage humanity has wreaked upon natural environments.

Globally, the TX2 program—aiming to **double the number of tigers** living in the wild—has shown thrilling signs of progress. For the first time in history tiger numbers are on the rise.

At home in Australia, in the aftermath of the disastrous bushfires of 2019–20, WWF-Australia launched **Regenerate Australia**, a visionary program to respond urgently to the needs of fire-affected wildlife; protect & restore what remains; and future-proof Australia's landscapes.

In the coming decade WWF is committed to:

- Protect at least 30% of all land, sea and freshwater;
- Halt species extinction caused by human activity;
- Halve the footprint of consumption and production;
- Support Indigenous Peoples and local communities to govern and sustainably manage their lands, territories and waters;
- Feed the world within planetary boundaries;
- Shape the global nature agenda through policy and advocacy.

Our goals are ambitious, but they must be. For species like tigers and koalas this is not a matter of conviction—it is their last chance.

We must act.

The decision to give the greatest gift of all is an act of hope in a future where the most vulnerable species can thrive in their natural environment once more. A hope that the impact of humans can be reversed and our precious environment returned to what it once was.


It requires visionary people determined to make the crucial decision to protect our planet.

Nick's connection to the Great Barrier Reef was formed at a very early age. His dad was a dive boat captain, and Nick spent his childhood in the reefs and coral islands between Mackay and Cooktown.

Exploring the wonder of one of the world's most diverse and precious environments, Nick was horrified to return home years later and see the destruction of this precious site. The Reef was, in his words, 'turning to rubble.'

Observing the once rainbow-coloured corals turned brown and white as they decayed—Nick vowed to devote his working life to conserving what was left. He joined the WWF team to protect the Reef from pollution, overfishing and other human impacts.

"While I have seen many wins over the years I have also come to realise that my

lifetime will not be enough. The natural places we love will always be prey to exploitation.

"I chose to leave a gift in my Will to WWF to fight for the Great Barrier Reef when I am no longer around to fight for it myself.

The reputation of this dedicated duo led to an endearing nickname—the 'Bobcats.' Their blended name is a nod to the animals and habitats they protect, and the global conservation movement they support.

Precious memories of a life dedicated to protecting animals is part of what inspired Cathy and Bob to plan for a future—one where animals continue to receive the specialised care they need.


Cathy knows that by including a gift to WWF in her Will she is helping to ensure that no animal is forgotten in the face of disaster.

SPEAK TO YOUR FAMILY AND LOVED ONES

Making or updating your Will is an incredibly personal and significant decision.

Consider your family and friends. Reflect on leaving a gift to WWF—even a gift of 1% of your estate will help to protect the animals you care about—and discuss your decision with your loved ones, sharing your vision for the future with them.

DECIDE WHAT KIND OF GIFT TO LEAVE

A residual bequest has the greatest impact in the future. You can make a gift of the residue (remainder) of your estate, or a share of the residue, once other specific gifts and expenses have been taken care of.

You can also choose to leave a percentage share of your estate or a specific bequest in your Will. 03

ENLIST THE HELP OF A PROFESSIONAL

Your Will is an important legal document, and should be worded correctly to ensure your wishes are carried out.

A solicitor or public trustee can help you with this process. You may also wish to consider creating a free legal Will online. Visit our partners at gatheredhere.com.au/wwf to see if this option is right for you.

CREATE YOUR LEGACY FOR NATURE

To include a gift to WWF-Australia, all you need is our ABN 57 001 594 074 and registered name—World Wide Fund for Nature Australia.

You may wish to use our recommended wording:

I give to World Wide Fund for Nature Australia (ABN 57 001 594 074) free of all taxes and other deductions (the residue of my estate / a ____% share of my estate / the sum of \$____) for its general purposes, and the receipt given on behalf of the World Wide Fund for Nature Australia shall be sufficient discharge to my trustee.
